In FY 2025 the Roca Impact Institute trained and coached **over 2,700** community violence interrupters, case workers, juvenile and adult corrections staff and police officers.

FIELD BUILDING

- Partnered with Cities United to offer a **free Rewire CBT refresher**, open to all Rewire CBT trained professionals attending the convening.
- **Produced a Rewire CBT skill refresher video series**, free to all trained Rewire CBT practitioners.
- Collaborated with Chicago CRED and Institute for Nonviolence Chicago at the annual Giffords Convening to deliver a **workshop on how CBT can work in CVI settings**.

CITY OF ST LOUIS OFFICE OF VIOLENCE PREVENTION

Funded by the City of St Louis' OVP, RII is working as one of three TTA providers helping to launch St Louis' regional gun violence prevention initiative. As part of a multi-year contract, RII is training over 200 practitioners from community providers in Rewire CBT with the goal of having Rewire CBT become a shared intervention across the region.

RII is providing TTA to DCYF to utilize Rewire CBT and peacemaking circles as core skill-building strategies at their newly designed and staffed youth justice and rehabilitation facility. Work includes ongoing training, coaching, and support for staff to implement and sustain over time.
